Product Description: A website containing comprehensive life histories for all bird species and families.

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Notes: The Birds of the World website contains more than 100,000 pages and is continually scanned by Siteimprove Enterprise. This report applies a strict definition of "Partially Supports" to include functionality that has a very small percentage of success criteria failures. There are instances of overwhelming conformance (e.g., minimum contrast, parsing) where the failure rate is less than 0.001 percent and are nevertheless designated Partially Supports. The Birds of the World website includes both open-access and subscription content – this report does not include the user log-in flow or the ecommerce user flow.

Evaluation Methods Used: This website was evaluated in Chrome browser (version 96.0.4664.110) on Mac Monterey 12.0.1 using Siteimprove, Wave, aXe, ANDI, and other automated accessibility tools as well as with Siteimprove Enterprise. Manual and screen reader accessibility was evaluated using hands-on keyboard operation, VoiceOver in Safari (Version 15.1) on Mac Monterey.
